This year's celebration included a reception, a vendor fair for LFBC's own black entrepreneurs, and two virtual workshops on the *"Pan-African Movement"* facilitated by Pastor Love.

• <u>Sunday, February 18</u> – Dr. Angelique Walker-Smith, North American President of the World's Council of Churches delivered God's Word on, "What Does Delivery Look Like: Zipporah's Story-Part 2," Luke 10:35-37 & Exodus 2:16-25. Following worship, a book signing reception was held in her honor. Dr. Walker-Smith shared great in-depth insights from her book, "Ahead of Her Time: *Pan-African Women of Faith and the Visions of Christian Unity, Mission & Justice.*"

Wednesday, February 26 – 7:00 pm was the first segment of the virtual workshop. Pastor Love shared amazing insights on: I. Pan-Africanism Philosophy;
II. Pan-Africanism For Dignity, Justice and Peace;
III. Transnationals Migration; IV. An Evidence-Based Approach to Addressing Systemic and Structural Racism; and V. Health Well-Being & Intergenerational Trauma. The workshop generated much discussion. Twenty-five members attended.

• <u>Sunday, February 25</u> – Following 11:00 am worship was the Vendor Fair, where Lilydale's 16 entrepreneurs set up their tables. Members and friends had the luxury of shopping from one meticulously arranged table to another. The vendors were very knowledgeable about their products. Pastor Love stated that it "was better than he could ever have imagined in his wildest dreams."

• <u>Wednesday, February 28</u> – At 7:00 pm, was the second segment of the "*Pan-African*

Movement," and a slide presentation on a *Journey to Ghana* by Deacon Thomas Savage, Sr. Five Lilydale Families traveled to Ghana at different times: Sis. Geraldine Turner and daughter, Attorney LeDeidre Turner, touring Ghana with the Alpha Kappa Sorority (A.K.A.); Deacon Thomas Savage, Sr. and Retired Judge Drella Savage toured Ghana with the National Bar Association; Deacon Johnny and Mrs. Leilani Howell, and Sis. Delorse and Jukube Felton traveled with a different tour.

During the slide presentations, each family offered their experiences at the same tourist location, receiving different kinds of "Tour Welcomes" into Ghana. The Savages' welcome was held at the King's Palace where all 160 tourists were served different delicacies and assorted beverages.

All five families' tours included:

• *The Snake River/Ghana's Ancestral River* – The attire to step into the river was white. Attendees sang hymns and prayed.

• *The Dungeon* – Slaves who were housed in the dungeon never came out. Inside lies a dingy and dimly lighted corridor that led to • *The Door of No Return*.

• *The Market Place* – Is a famous tourist spot to purchase clothes, jewelry, pictures, etc. at prices much lower than the U.S. dollar.

• *The Name Ceremony* – Eight days after the birth of a child, a ceremony is held to name that child based upon the gender and day of the week. LFBC members participated in separated ceremonies and each one was given an African name.

 Ancestral Worship – Is "believed" to ensure that harmony and balance is maintained in the community. The "ancestors" serve as the intermediaries between
→ the Living and God. The service included a lot of dancing and was filled to capacity with adults and children.

All five families went to different mission fields and participated in their events.

Deacon Cleve and Mrs. Jacquelyn Gilmore is the next family traveling to Ghana.

Lilydale's Son Helps People In Need Of Food!

"If you had told me starting a nonprofit to help people who need food is part of the plan for my life, I would have said, Who? Me? Start a nonprofit?", says Kevin M. Yates. Lilydale's very own son, founded and leads a 501(c) (3) nonprofit organization. *Meals in the Meantime*, focuses on helping people who need food in Chicagoland south suburbs with pop-up food pantries. It's an unexpected path on Kevin's life journey and one for which he is truly grateful.

Meals in the Meantime is a God-given assignment says Kevin. "I remember the day, it was Tuesday, March 9, 2021, where I had just awakened and was lying in bed meditating and praying about my life and its purpose. I've had a lot of personal and professional success, and it was feeling like a lot of my time and efforts had been narrowly focused on me. I asked God to give me a higher purpose. The purpose He gave me was to help people who need food. The vision He gave me was *Meals in the Meantime*."

Meals in the Meantime is in its fourth year of operation and has helped food-insecure populations across Chicagoland south suburbs. In fact, the first pantry was held at Lilydale's Legacy Campus in Park Forest, Illinois, in May 2021. "It meant a lot to me for Rev. Love to offer our new campus as the first location for our popup pantry. And He helped us find the food too! Clearly, God was in the plan."

There's an intentional focus on food that sustains good health and well-being. Having given away nearly 10,000 pounds of fresh fruits and vegetables, *Meals in the Meantime* stays true its mission of filling the food gap with nourishment and dignity. "Food insecurity is a condition, not a condemnation. We're changing the \rightarrow



condition with Meals in the Meantime," says Kevin.

Kevin's vision for *Meals in the Mealtime*'s future is bold and big. "I want to increase the number of pantries we provide and reach more people in Chicagoland south suburbs. Hunger is a real thing. Those of us who have access to food take for granted that all we have to do is open our refrigerator or kitchen cabinet, or go to the grocery store, or go to a restaurant when we're hungry. There are families, seniors and adults young and old, who are literally hungry because they don't have access to food. My vision for *Meals in the Meantime* is ensuring food-insecure populations get access to free, fresh, healthy, high-quality food."

The good work Kevin is doing with *Meals in the Meantime* is blessed and highly favored. "I'm grateful for the vision God gave me. It wasn't the plan I had for my life but as we all know, our plans are not always God's plan. We've been successful beyond what I could have imagined and most importantly, we're filling the food gap. I can see God's hand directing our path and leading our way and for that, I am grateful. I thank God for *Meals in the Meantime*."

We give glory to God for blessing Bro. Kevin Yates with this awesome ministry that feeds *hundreds upon hundreds* of people of all ethnicities, nationalities, races, religions and sexes.

Thank you Bro. Kevin for being obedient to God's plan for your life. May His abundant blessings be yours to enjoy through eternity.


