SMALL CELL LUNG CANCER CONFERENCE

On Saturday, May 18th, Lilydale First Baptist hosted the H.E.A.L. Collaborative and AMGEN Conference on Small Cell Lung Cancer at the Legacy Campus.

Misconceptions about Small Cell Lung Cancer (SCLC):

- There's no treatment. SCLC does not spread beyond the lungs. I'm too young to have Lung Cancer.
- Smoking cigarettes are the only risk factor for SCLC.
- Former smokers cannot develop SCLC.

The risk for developing SCLC is much higher for current or former tobacco smokers. However, SCLC can also be caused by exposure to secondhand smoke, asbestos, some inhaled chemicals, radiation and air pollution. Those with a family history of lung cancer may also be at higher risk.

WHAT FEAST AM I?

Brain Teasers By Sis. Carolyn Comer

- 1. God sent a deliverer to the Israelites to free them from Egyptian bondage. After several plagues had no effect on Pharoah's hardened heart, God sent one more plague; the firstborn of every household would die when the destroyer came. But God instructed Israel to put lamb's blood on their doorposts so that death would not come to their homes and finally, Pharoah let them go. Israel celebrated their deliverance with a meal of fire-roasted lamb, bitter herbs and unleavened bread. To this day, the Jewish people recognize their freedom with a Seder meal during this holiday. What feast am I?
- 2. When the Hebrews left Egypt, they did so as quickly as possible. There wasn't time for the usual careful preparation of meals, such as using yeast and waiting for bread to rise. The day after their ceremonial meal, a new feast began. The Jews were told to remove yeast from their homes for 7 days and hold a sacred assembly on the first and last days. Working was not permitted except to prepare meals for everyone to eat. During this time, bread must be made without yeast, symbolizing the "bread of haste" eaten when Israel was delivered from slavery. What feast am I?
- 3. The most holy of festivals was marked by elaborate rituals and sacrifices by the High Priest, who was allowed into the Holy of Holies annually on this special occasion. To enter at any other time brought death. The priest first bathed before entering the tabernacle. Then a series of sin offerings were made; first for the priest and his family and then for Israel. Today, Jews celebrate with a 25-hour period of intense prayer and fasting and spend most of the day in synagogue services. What feast am I and what is my familiar Hebrew name?

MENTAL HEALTH A Growing Illness for Black Americans

We referenced this article being inspired by the General Mission, under the presidency of Sis. Karen Cook Turner, for bringing awareness of Mental Health to the church congregation, as part of the Ethel Simpson Community Outreach Program: The **HELP** Rally.

Mental Health disorders are challenging illnesses faced by millions of Americans. Often, the condition goes unnoticed and people suffer in silence, not wanting to be labeled as a, "crazy person" or characterized by negative stigmas like, "the elevator doesn't go all the way up" or "looney tune".

On Sunday, May 26, during the 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. worship services, two inspiring presentations on Mental Health were made by Sis. Michelle Johnson, *President of the Nurses' Aide Ministry*, and *Sis*. Kelly Cook, *Board Certified Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse Practitioner*, respectively.

Sis. Johnson reported that nearly one in five adults in the United States have a mental health condition.

• Forty-eight million have anxiety disorders; • Twenty-one million have major depression; • Nine million have post-traumatic stress disorders; • Seven million have bipolar disorder; • Three point five million have borderline personality disorder; • Three million have obsessive compulsion disorder; and • One point five million have schizophrenia.

With such alarming numbers that keep rising, Sis. Johnson further stated that, "if there is someone in your life struggling with their mental health, the best thing you can do is reach out and start a conversation, educate yourself on the realities of living with mental health issues and confront any feelings of stigma or judgement you may have." \rightarrow

Sis. Kelly Cook also highlighted some statistics with emphasis on the Black Community. She shared how Mental Health stigmas originated in the Black Community, tracing it back to our ancestors.

Sis. Cook pointed out that research suggests that the adult Black Community is 20% more likely to experience serious mental health problems such as major depression disorders or generalized anxiety disorders. Only 25 percent of African Americans seek mental health treatment compared to 40 percent of White Americans. The suicide rates for people of color continue to rise, with Black Americans facing a 58 percent increase in suicide rates between 2011 and 2021. Blacks are nearly twice as likely as whites to be diagnosed with schizophrenia. Over 25 percent of Black youth exposed to violence have proven to be at high risk for post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

"We can all play a part in reducing stigmas by changing the language and attitudes we have about mental illnesses," Sis. Cook emphatically stated.

In digesting all the information that was shared in both presentations, it is our prayer as saints of God, who is "no respecter of persons" (Acts 10:34), that we will squash those stigmas, and declare to them God's love for them, who says, "For I know the plans I have for you ... plans to give you a hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11).

In inquiring about course content, the delegates reported that Dean Gardner used his own life's story, being the prodigal son (alcoholic, in prison, etc.) of a preacher-dad, to illustrate how God can change a person into becoming His disciple. The class was well attended with standing room only. The class lecturer was, Rev. Craig Jenkins of Beth Eden MBC, Chicago, IL.

Rev. Momon and Sis. Powell shared that "In every session, the sermons and addresses by Dean Carl Washington and Congress Dean Cuff were very enlightening, as well as the late-night services."

The delegates are very grateful to Pastor Love and Sunday School Superintendent Sis. Vikki McKenzie for the wonderful opportunity to attend the National Congress. Their mantra is to be obedient to the Great Commission (Matthew 28:19-20), "Go make disciples, teaching them to hear and obey God's Word!"
